Placemat Guidelines

Overview: At each meal during the Weekend, a placement accompanies each plate. It is usually a free-hand drawing or colored drawing and has the first name of the person (usually a child or youth) that provided it. The placemats are another tangible form of agape (Christ-like love).

- Placemats should be on white paper, tabloid size (11" x 17") and printed in Landscape Orientation (long-ways from left to right when placed on the table).
- The placemat should have the first name of the person who created it (first name only, no ages or location).
- The artwork may be a free form drawing, handprint, etc. or it may be a pre-printed outline that is colored in.
- The drawing can be of anything but should be appropriate (animals, nature, Biblical stories, inspirational messages, etc.).
- Colored pencils, crayons and/or markers are all acceptable.
- A short inspirational comment or Bible verse is acceptable, but refrain from comments about the Brothers' incarceration.
- No glitter, paint, glue, stickers, etc. on the drawing.
- No perfumes.
